From the Pastor's Desk:

As Lent draws near, many Catholics start thinking about what they'll give up or how to make it the "*best Lent ever*." The pressure to pray more, fast, and give alms can sometimes feel like a checklist, as if we're just trying to survive the next 40 days without falling into Catholic guilt. But what if we approached this season differently? Instead of seeing Lent as a path to perfection, what if we viewed our Lenten commitments as an invitation to receive what Jesus truly desires to do in us? Ultimately, Lent isn't about what we do, but about how God works in us.

Here are a few ideas to consider before Lent begins on Wednesday, March 5th:

PRAYING, FASTING, AND ALMSGIVING: A PATH TO RELATIONSHIP

The traditional Lenten practices, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, are ways to build virtuous relationships: with God, ourselves, and others. For example, consider fasting from negative thoughts about yourself and replacing them with short prayers. Try fasting from uncharitable thoughts and gossip about others. Maybe this Lent, you could dedicate more time to being present with your family in shared spaces, or even plan to have meals together at the table, a simple yet powerful way to strengthen bonds. Or perhaps, you'll encounter God more deeply through the Sacraments of Confession and the Eucharist, or by reading and praying with your Bible more often. As you make your Lenten plans, bring them to God, not as tasks to check off, but as part of your relationship with Him and with those around you. Remember, Lent is ultimately about the relationships you nurture: with God, others, and yourself.

DIGGING TO THE ROOT OF YOUR SIN

Take a moment to reflect: What is the root cause of your sin? Is it pride, selfishness, greed, or apathy? Identifying the deeper patterns behind your sin isn't about beating yourself up or wallowing in guilt, it's about addressing the root so, with Jesus' help, you can sever your connection to the poison of sin. Our goal is to get to the heart of the matter, for it's in the heart where sin takes root. As part of your Lenten journey, make a plan to go to Confession to seek forgiveness and healing.

JOURNEYING THROUGH LENT WITH JESUS

Imagine sharing the next 40 days of Lent with Jesus, inviting Him into every moment. How often do we have intimate conversations with Him, or even just pause to ask, "*Jesus, what do you think about this?*" Or, when something joyful happens, do we take a moment to pray, "*Thank you, Jesus, for being here with me and sharing this joy?*" Ask God to help you recognize His presence more deeply throughout each day. Let Lent be a time to cultivate a more intimate relationship with Jesus, through both the big and small moments of your life.

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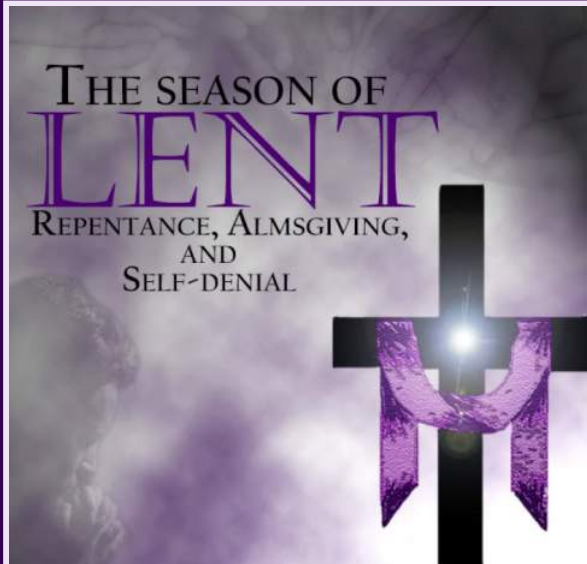

ROMAN CATHOLIC DIOCESE OF PROVIDENCE 2025 GUIDELINES FOR LENT

Lenten Fast and Abstinence Regulations

Abstinence from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent (for those 14 and older) is required by Church law. Also, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting: those between the ages of 18 and 59 should eat less, meaning, take no solid food between meals and only one full meal that day. Serious health conditions excuse a person from these precepts. Pastors and parents are encouraged by the law of the Church to ensure that minors who are not bound by the law of fast and abstinence are educated nonetheless in an authentic sense of penance. Following the implementation of the revised Code of Canon Law on November 27, 1983, the National Conference of Catholic Bishops in the United States determined that the rules

of fast and abstinence which have existed for the last several years in this country be maintained. Namely, that the faithful observe suitable penitential practices on all Fridays throughout the year. These penitential practices need not include abstaining from meat. However, as indicated above, the faithful must not eat meat on all the Fridays of Lent as well as on Ash Wednesday. They must also observe faithfully the fast regulations as they have been stated above in accord with the universal law of the Church (Code of Canon Law, 1250-1252).

Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving

Lent is above all a time of prayer. To enhance the practice of prayer, the Church invites her members to follow the custom of fasting and to accompany that fasting with an increase of almsgiving for the needs of the poor. St. Augustine, in a sermon on Lent, teaches that: *Through humility and charity, fasting and almsgiving, abstaining and forgiving, avoiding evil and doing good, our prayer seeks peace and achieves it* (Sermon 206).

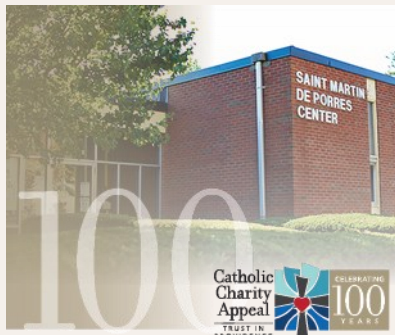

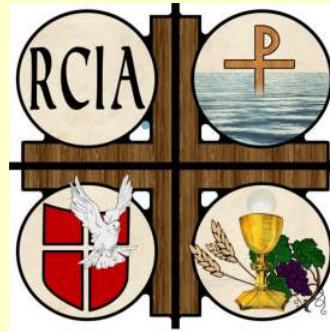

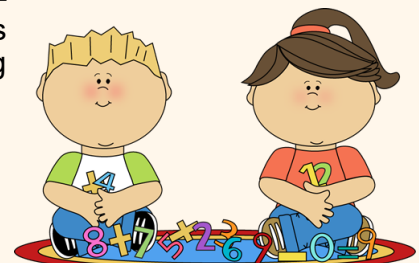
The children are able to recognize their names. Some of our new students need some help at times and the older classmates help them. Imagine that! They are all making progress writing their names in upper case and our goal is that all the children will be able to do so by June.

The preschoolers are doing a fantastic job in math, as well. They are learning to write numbers zero through nineteen thus far. They understand one-to-one correspondence and they can make ABAB patterns using various materials. The children know the days of the week and the months of the year.



Our religion curriculum God Made Me is an exceptional program. We recently finished Unit 3 "God Made Me Happy" which included a chapter "I Can Pray". They talked about prayers of thanks and praise. The children bless themselves and say grace before snacks and lunch. After learning that mornings and evenings are good times for prayer, they made doorknob hangers as prayer reminders. I also purchased a set of books that I added to the lesson. Each book title starts with "God, I Need to Talk to you about...". The subjects range from sharing, paying attention and even talking back. The books are a great learning tool and show the children the many different ways that a young child can pray to God and ask for forgiveness.

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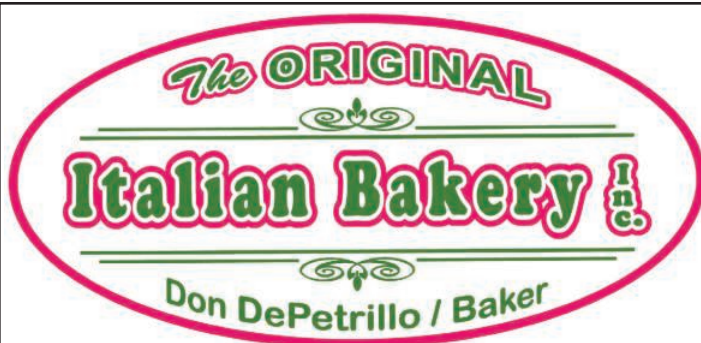
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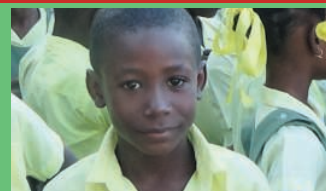
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
