From the Pastor's Desk:

2nd Sunday of Lent

As we begin this 2nd week of Lent, we can look at this Holy Season in one of two ways. We can see it negatively as a time of deprivation, or we can see it positively as an opportunity for growth. The Church hopes we will have a positive spirit because Lent offers us the opportunity to transform our lives. This is why the Gospel today, the account of the Transfiguration, is chosen for the 2nd Sunday of Lent.

In the Gospel, Our Lord reveals the great Lenten theme of transformation; He also begins to reveal the Paschal Mystery. Our Lord goes up the mountain to pray, and there He becomes transfigured. His face changes and His garments become dazzlingly white. This manifestation prefigured Our Lord's glory as the result His death and resurrection. It helps us to understand joy coming from suffering, exaltation from humiliation, and life coming from death. That's the transformation which is at the very heart of our Lenten Journey.

The Transfiguration speaks to us of the gradual process of change that takes place in our own lives when we walk with Our Lord on the road to Calvary. We can become so wrapped up with the everyday concerns of living we often lose sight of the end to which we have all been called. We can be dragged down with feelings of failure and worthlessness; but suddenly a piece of good news, a spark of joy, hope or love changes our outlook and we see our lives in a new and better light. We recognize Christ again.

God wants us is to share in this Transformation and in the Paschal Mystery. We began our sharing through Baptism. Our Baptism was a transformation for us. We were given a white garment to remind us we had become like Our Lord in His Transfiguration. As the Transfiguration was a prelude for Our Lord to His resurrection, so Baptism allows us to share in that same glory.

The Body and Blood of the Lord in the Eucharist will nourish us on our way to that destiny. At Mass we go in procession to receive communion as a symbol of a people who are on a journey. Receiving communion is a sign of our faith in the promise of Our Lord: *"Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have life eternal and I will raise them up on the last day."*

As Baptism begins our sharing in the Paschal Mystery, so the Eucharist will perfect and complete it. We should never forget the Mass is our means for participating in the Paschal Mystery since the Eucharist is the Sacrament of the death and resurrection of Our Lord. In the Mass we find meaning and purpose for our human existence. The world is not a stage on which a play is enacted. Rather the world is part of God's Kingdom of truth and life. And the truth is: we are going on a journey, but our journey is not a death march. Instead we come to the fullness of our likeness to Christ as the children of God....





2025 GUIDELINES FOR LENT**

*Why are the Gloria and Alleluia
omitted during Lent?*

The Lenten Season is marked by two very distinct Liturgical Omissions. Neither the hymn known as the Gloria (Glory to God in the Highest) nor the Alleluia verse sung before the Gospel is permitted during the entire 40 days of Lent (with a few small exceptions). Why is that?

First of all, the Gloria is a hymn that celebrates the coming of the Lord using words from the Angels at Christ's birth. The Church during Lent returns in spirit to a time when the people of God were in exile, waiting for the Messia-

h to come and save them. It's a similar season of expectation as is Advent, but instead of awaiting Christ's birth from the womb of Mary, the Christian people await Christ's second "birth" from the womb of the Sepulcher.

Secondly, following this same spirit of exile, the Church joins Moses and the Israelites as they wander in the desert for 40 years. It's a time of agony and purification, one where the faithful join together in saying, "How shall we sing the Lord's song in a foreign land?" (Psalm 137:4) The word "Alleluia" is rooted in a Hebrew expression that means "praise the Lord" and is thus omitted during Lent.

As a result, our focus in Lent is not in rejoicing, but in mourning our sins, looking at those things that prevent us from an authentic relationship with God. Once these are removed through Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving, we are able to rejoice again at Easter, for it's not only Christ's Resurrection that we celebrate, but our own rebirth in the spirit.



St. Joseph *Feast: March 19th*

Even though St. Joseph never spoke a word in scripture, his silent example of obedient faithfulness and diligent care for the Holy Family during Jesus' formative years has made him one of the most beloved saints of Christianity. Devotion to the foster-father of Jesus is generally traced to the 3rd or 4th century, but according to the Pieta prayer book, there is a prayer to St. Joseph that dates to the year 50. In 1505, it was sent from Pope Julius


II to Emperor Charles when he was going into battle. Whoever shall read this prayer or hear it or keep it about themselves, shall never die a sudden death or be drowned, nor shall poison take effect on them; neither shall they fall into the hands of the enemy or be burned in any fire or be overpowered in battle.

Prayer to St. Joseph: *O St. Joseph, whose protection is so great, so strong, so prompt before the throne of God, I place in you all my interest and desires. O St. Joseph, do assist me by your powerful intercession, and obtain for me from your divine Son all spiritual blessings, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. So that, having engaged here below your heavenly power, I may offer my thanksgiving and homage to the most loving of Fathers. O St. Joseph, I never weary of contemplating you, and Jesus asleep in your arms; I dare not approach while He reposes near your heart. Press Him close in my name and kiss His fine head for me and ask Him to return the kiss when I draw my dying breath. St. Joseph, patron of departing souls, pray for me. Amen.*



Classroom News.. Mrs. Brenda Tavares PK 4 A



It is amazing to me how fast a school year goes by; we have already completed over one hundred days of the 2024-2025 school year. The students in Pre-K 4 are growing and learning every day. We are continuing our journey through the alphabet. We are already working on the letter U; we will make an Umbrella and unicorn. We are continuing in our Heggerty program to help us learn the letter sound, and rhyming words!

We are working on our numbers, recognizing the numbers up to twenty and putting them in order. We just read a book about “10 Shiny Snowflakes”, we made our own version of the book by writing the numerals from one to ten on the top of the page and writing the number word on the bottom of the page. We then put the correct number of “snowflakes” (glitter dots) on the page. After April vacation we will use whiteboards to draw shapes, write numerals and number words as well as color words and upper and lowercase letters. We are learning about the various parts of a book. We are learning to identify the front cover, the back cover, the spine or binding, the title and that the author writes the words, and the illustrator draws the pictures.



The Pre-K students are working hard on their cutting skills. The children are often at the writing center cutting paper and gluing it together to make pictures and books. We are beginning to learn about space and the planets. The students enjoy bringing our classroom to life with planets, asteroids, and comets. The students are continuing to get ready for Kindergarten. We have been working on rhyming words, sequencing events in a story and measuring. After April vacation we



will learn about butterflies, the weather, the different seasons, and plants. We will watch caterpillars grow into butterflies and release them into the trees. We will also plant our own flowers and enjoy watching them grow. Before you know it, we will be planning our end of the year activities, and it will be time for the children to move on to kindergarten. The year always goes by so quickly.
