Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary
Feast: November 21st

Though it cannot be proven historically, Mary's presentation has an important theological purpose. It continues the impact of the feasts of the Immaculate Conception (December 8th) and of the birth of Mary (September 8th). It emphasizes that the holiness conferred on Mary from the beginning of her life on earth continued through her early childhood and beyond.

"Hail, holy throne of God, divine sanctuary, house of glory, jewel most fair, chosen treasure house, and mercy seat for the whole world, heaven showing forth the glory of God. Purest Virgin, worthy of all praise, sanctuary dedicated to God and raised above all human condition, virgin soil, unplowed field, flourishing vine, fountain pouring out waters, virgin bearing a child, mother without knowing man, hidden treasure of innocence, ornament of sanctity, by your most acceptable prayers, strong with the authority of motherhood, to our Lord and God, Creator of all, your Son who was born of you without a father, steer the ship of the Church and bring it to a quiet harbor"

## From the Pastor's Desk:

At first glance, November can feel a bit dreary: The days are shorter, the air turns sharp, and nature itself is winding down for a long winter's rest. It's not surprising then that we may feel a little low, and feel a little negative towards this unassuming month. Yet, hidden within its gray skies and quiet landscapes, there's an unexpected beauty in to be seen in November, a beauty that can bring surprising hope, especially if we approach it with open hearts and maybe even a giggle or two.

### A PAUSE BUTTON WE NEED

November may feel like a lull, but sometimes a pause is exactly what we need. After the rush and riot of summer and getting kids back to school, and the flurry of pumpkin-spiced everything, November grants us a moment to breathe. There's a calmness in

the way trees shed their last leaves, almost as if nature is reminding us, that we, too, can let go, take a well-earned break, and gather our strength. And the month's pace almost forces us to step back, reflect on the year, and prepare for what's to come. Even the weather has a way of slowing us down: chilly mornings that make us pull the blankets a little closer and dusky afternoons that feel like a gentle nudge to wrap up the day early. This season invites us to slow our pace -- not necessarily out of exhaustion, but as a chance to recharge. November almost prompts us to rest so we can embrace the upcoming December excitement.

### THE QUIET LANDSCAPE

By November, most of the vibrant colors of autumn have faded. Instead, we're left with bare branches, frosty mornings, and that soft, gray light that seems to linger all day long. While you might see this as dull, in its quiet simplicity, there's actually a new beauty to be discovered. This openness in nature can remind us to look deeper, to appreciate subtle things we might have overlooked. There's beauty in a single, resilient leaf clinging to a branch, or the way frost gathers on the grass. November's simplicity has a way of making us feel connected to something steady and timeless, with a stark reminder of what we can look forward to.

### ZONING IN ON GRATITUDE

The month is also geared toward Thanksgiving, the crown jewel of November, and a holiday centered on one of life's most underrated virtues: gratitude. While we may joke about the family drama and the inevitable overindulgence, Thanksgiving is ultimately a reminder to appreciate what we have, who we are, and the people who've joined us on our journey. In a way, Thanksgiving is an invitation to look at November itself with new eyes. It asks us to step back from our usual complaints about the weather, the short days, or winter's stealth-like approach and instead focus on our blessings. Certainly, things may not be perfect; we may still have worries, and the world around us may seem more bare and chilly than vibrant and full. But this holiday teaches us that hope often springs from recognizing what we already have, and that sometimes, the most profound joys come from ordinary things: a warm meal, a good laugh, a cozy evening indoors.

### MOMENTS FOR LAUGHTER

One of November's hidden gifts is the reminder to laugh a little at life's quirks. Nature may be slowing down, but the absurdities of life keep chugging along, no matter the season. November's idiosyncrasies invite us to meet life's small annoyances with a smile, whether it's the challenge of raking leaves in windy weather, the frantic scramble to find a winter coat that actually fits, or the inevitable "who-didn't-bring-a-dish?" moment at Thanksgiving dinner. There's hope in finding humor in the mundane and realizing that every season has its challenges, but also its laughter. And humor itself can be an act of resilience, a way of saying that despite the obstacles, there's fun to be had, and often when we least expect it.

### SHOWING HOPEFUL COURAGE

Finally, as November closes, it leaves us on the brink of winter. There's a kind of bravery required in this transition, an unspoken strength that allows us to face the darker, colder days ahead. But it's not a hopeless courage, it's a hopeful one. Because November, with its understated beauty and gentle reminders, teaches us that every season, even the toughest ones, holds its own promise.

Therefore, when the skies are gray and the trees bare, remember that November holds its own kind of hope. It's a hope that lives in simplicity, in laughter, and in gratitude. It's the hope that tells us that, even in the darkest times, there's beauty to be found, strength to be gathered, and joy waiting to be discovered. We just need to embrace it!

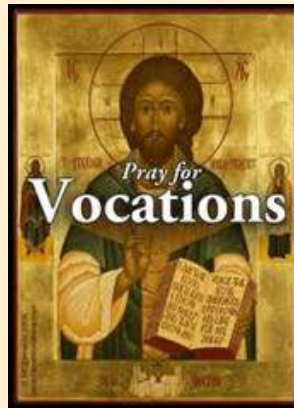

### Classroom News ~ Ms. Martin.. Grade 5



This fall, St Rocco's fifth graders have engaged in many learning activities to expand their academic, social-emotional, religious, and executive functioning skills as well as to develop their knowledge and curiosity about the world in which they live.

In English Language Arts, the children have read different genres such as informational text, historical fiction, realistic fiction, and poetry to gain insight into how people in the past and present have taken journeys to challenge themselves, make discoveries, and to achieve better lives. Through close reading, annotation, and analysis skills used, students have worked together in "station rotation" designed activities that build upon fluency, comprehension, word study, and writing lessons.

This trimester, our class has had the pleasure of collaborating with Providence College student teachers who support the children in small groups developing math concepts. Through solving addition and multiplication word problems, using estimation and exactness, students learned how these skills and strategies can be utilized when shopping or running a business. The goal is for students to realize the realistic purpose and application of math skills to benefit their lives.



In Science and Social Studies lessons, students continued to investigate their world. Through discovering the similarities and differences found amongst animal and plant cells and within the United States geography, the children learn how cells and people function in different environments to promote growth and survival.

Our religious studies have developed students' understanding of the Catholic Christian identity. We have discussed ways in which Jesus calls us to worship through the seven sacraments. Students learned about the significance of Baptism and Confirmation in their spiritual lives. Our focus on the virtues of kindness, courage, and thankfulness were put into action through making get well cards for a staff member. Through mindfulness activities of daily meditation/breathing, students are learning to promote calm and feelings of peacefulness within and around themselves.



In our learning community, we work together to support, model, and motivate each other to be learners who make mistakes but persevere and celebrate each other's achievements.
